OUTDOOR RANGE RULES

THE USE OF ALCOHOL AND OR MARIJUANA ARE NOT ALLOWED PRIOR TO SHOOTING

- ALWAYS Practice safe firearm handling techniques.
- 2. ALWAYS Keep your firearm pointed in a safe direction.
- ALWAYS Keep your finger off the trigger and outside of the trigger guard until you're ready to shoot.
- 4. HEARING and EYE protection must be worn at all times by everyone when the firing line is hot.
- 5. All firearms brought onto the outdoor range shall be in a case, magazines removed, chamber empty with chamber flag in place.
- 6. Holstered firearms worn by concealed carry weapon (ccw) permit holders are excluded from this rule.
- 7. Chamber flags or an empty chamber indicator are required for all firearms brought onto the outdoor range. This can be a chamber flag, cable lock through the chamber or other suitable devices. Ensure your chamber flags are in place before coming to the club. The parking lot is not an appropriate place to insert chamber flags.
- 8. Firearms shall be uncased and cased (unholstered and holstered) while in the stall, or at the bench, on the firing line with the muzzle(s) pointed down range. Opening a case and exposing a firearm on the back bench is not allowed. Practice draws or shooting from the holster is not allowed on the outdoor range.
- 9. Uncased (unholstered) firearms shall not leave the stall or bench on the firing line.
- 10. Handling a firearm outside of the stall or bench on the firing line is not allowed.
- 11. Chamber flags shall be used at any time a firearm is not in use to clearly indicated the firearm is not loaded.
- 12. Chamber flags shall be inserted prior to placing a firearm in a case and removing the cased firearm from the stall or bench on the firing line.
- 13. Magazines can be loaded on the back bench provided access to the ammunition and or the magazines does not require exposing a firearm on the back bench.
- 14. No one may go forward of the firing line until the line has been cleared of shooters and the warning system, "HORN and LIGHTS "have been activated.
- 15. The range is not safe until all firearms are emptied with actions open, clips/magazines removed, and safeties placed in the on position. Firearms must be benched and pointed downrange or in a rack, and everyone in the range area must be aware that a range

safe condition is being called. Terms such as, "The line is clear," "The range is clear," or "The range is safe" may be used to announce a safe range condition.

There is a range safety flag at the 100-yard line and it must be up whenever anyone goes beyond it. The last person returning from downrange is responsible for returning the flag to the 100yd holder.

- 16. No one may handle, adjust, or touch any firearms when anyone is downrange.
- 17. When not in use, all firearms shall be unloaded, actions open, and the firearm shall be pointed in a safe direction. With a chamber flag or an empty chamber indicator in place.
- 18. Only two (2) guests are allowed and only one (1) shooter at a time, with only one (1) target, is allowed on the firing line. It is recommended that a guest apply for membership if they have visited the range five times.
- 19. Guests are not allowed down range for any reason, including policing brass.
- 20. The left side of the Range is reserved for Pistols, PPC (pistol caliber carbines) and .22 caliber rimfire rifles. NO AR Pistols 5.56/.223 are allowed on this side of the range.
- 21. The right side of the range is reserved for .22 cal. Rimfire rifles, center-fire caliber rifles, and black powder rifles, and AR 15 Pistols 5.56/.233., Pistols using bottle neck rifle cartridges ie: Remington xp100, and Contender type pistols. NO other PISTOLS are allowed. Do not use club target stands when shooting shotgun buckshot or bird shot.
- 22. Cross firing is not permitted on either range.
- 23. Duds shall be placed in the container marked "DUDS" on the bench.
 - Please police your spent shells after shooting and properly dispose in the spent brass receptacles. If the firing line is active DO NOT retrieve spent brass (on the grass) in front of the firing line unless the line has been made safe and cleared and the Warning lights and buzzer are activated.
- 24. Paper, cardboard, or other suitable shooting target may be used. Glass, cans or exploding targets are prohibited. Personal target frames must be constructed so the target is located at the same height as the club frames.
 - Stay safe and enjoy. Happy shooting.
- 25. Full automatic or multi-shot bursts are prohibited
- 26. No tracer, incendiary, or explosive ammo is allowed.
